Member Spotlight — Dr. Nicola Brown

Dr. Nicola Brown, psychologist, is a researcher with the Central Toronto Youth Services Pride & Prejudice (P&P) team and provides training to service providers looking to better their competency in working with LGBT clients. Adding to P&P's history of producing research-based and community resources about queer and trans youth, Nicola was the lead author for the well-received *Families in TRANSition: A Resource guide for parents of trans youth* (2008). Nicola Brown and Rebecca Hammond are Co-Principle Investigators on a partnership research project called *The Youth Gender Action Project (Y-GAP)*.

Transceptance and CTYS Partner to Enhance Services for the Families of Trans Youth.

Only months after releasing our groundbreaking publication "Families in TRANSition: A guide for the families of trans youth", Central Toronto Youth Services is pleased to announce a new partnership with Transceptance, a peer-support group for the parents of trans youth.

The partnership, which provides space and resources to support the ongoing operation of the Transceptance group, also includes the creation of a new service - the Families in TRANSition Group. Based in the content of the Families in TRANSition (FIT) Guide, the program will provide short-term support and education to parents who are just starting to come to terms with their child's gender.

"It became obvious to us that 'new' parents initially have particular needs. This program will prepare them for the next step, and may be a bridge to the Transceptance group" shares Catherine, Founder and past Facilitator of Transceptance, "The partnership with CTYS will ensure all parents have the support and assistance they need".

As a Children's Mental Health Centre, the partnership is a natural fit with the CTYS mandate. As Executive Director Heather Sproule explains "Sometimes, the best way to support a young person is to support their parents. Our family work program is one example of that philosophy and I'm proud that CTYS is providing this kind of innovative support and partnership to the parents and families involved in Transceptance."

The demand for services which target the trans community is growing, according to CTYS Researcher and Psychologist Nicola Brown. "We have seen a large increase in referrals of trans youth to our programs" explains Dr. Brown, "one-on-one counseling, the FIT Guide, our Y-GAP Research Project Partnership and this new partnership are some of the ways CTYS is able to contribute to the community. We will continue to look for new and innovative ways to support our young people."

The Families in TRANSition Group will run Tuesdays from 7:00pm to 8:30 pm.

Central Toronto Youth Services (CTYS)

CTYS is a community-based children's mental health centre located at the corner of Church and Wellesley in downtown Toronto. For 35 years, Central Toronto Youth Services has been providing innovative, transformational programming to many of the hardest to serve, most at-risk youth through the Greater Toronto Area, and their families.

In 1985, CTYS' Pride and Prejudice Program became the first organization in Canada to offer counseling services to LGBT youth. Since that time, the Program has offered consulting, training, counseling, group therapy and arts-based programs for queer and trans youth, all free of charge.

Transceptance

Transceptance is a peer-based support group for parents of transgendered and transsexual children. By sharing unique experiences, information and resources we can help our children transition safely. Formed by the mother of a transchild in 2003, Transceptance is a safe space for parents to share information and support regarding the unique experiences and challenges they face, no matter where they are in the 'acceptance' of their children.

Families in TRANSition Guide

Families In TRANSition: A Resource Guide for Parents of Trans Youth is the first comprehensive Canadian publication to address the needs of parents and families supporting their trans children. Families in TRANSition summarizes the experiences, strategies, and successes of a working group of community consultants - researchers, counsellors, parents, advocates as well as trans youth themselves. Families in TRANSition provides the stories of parents and youth along with practical and sensitive parent-to-parent and professional therapeutic advice. This guide was written and published by CTYS (Central Toronto Youth Services) with the support and collaboration of many community members and organizations, especially P-FLAG Toronto (Parents Family and Friends of Lesbians and Gays) and Transceptance (a Toronto support group for parents of trans youth).

SUICIDE RISK AND PREVENTION FOR LESBIAN, GAY, BISEXUAL AND TRANSGENDER YOUTH

Suicide Prevention Resource Center (SPRC) has released Suicide Risk and Prevention for lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender youth. Written by SPRC staff and reviewed by experts in sexual and gender minority issues, suicide, and suicide prevention, and by youth, this publication addresses the special concerns related to suicide prevention among lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender (LGBT) youth. This paper outlines recommendations for helping to reduce suicidal behavior among LGBT youth, and includes a resource appendix and an extensive bibliography.

CPATH Membership Categories

The Association welcomes applications for the following memberships:

- Full professional membership is available to professionals working in disciplines such as medicine, psychology, law, social work, counseling, psychotherapy, family studies, sociology, anthropology, speech and voice therapy and sexology. Full membership carries voting privileges within the Association.
- Organizational memberships are available at a reduced rate per person.
- **Supporting** membership is available to individuals who do not work in the professional disciplines listed above, but still have an interest in being an active member of the organization. Supporting membership carries no voting privileges.
- Emeritus membership is for current members of the Association who have been full members of the Association for the previous three years consecutively and are fully retired, making them eligible for a reduced membership rate. Emeritus members carry full voting privileges within the Association.
- Student membership carries no voting privileges, and requires sponsorship and recommendation by a full member along with proof of *current* full-time status as a graduate student in a program directly related to transgender health.
- Non-Waged membership carries no voting privileges, and requires proof of *current* non-waged activity for an organization directly related to transgender health.

- The opportunity to vote for Association Officers and Board members (full members and Emeritus only)
